

Public Consultation on the Schengen Facility for Croatia

Introduction

This consultation aims to collect opinions on the functioning of the Schengen Facility in Croatia and more specifically the successes and the obstacles in the implementation of the measures/actions implemented under this programme.

The general objectives of the Schengen Facility for Croatia was (a) to assist the country in order to enable taking of responsibility for controlling the flow of people across what would be the new external borders of the Schengen Area on behalf of other Schengen countries and (b) to ensure the preparedness of the country for accession to the Schengen Area.

The 9 operational objectives adopted by Croatia for the implementation of the Schengen Facility are the following:

1. Acquisition of new technical equipment for border control of the external borders
2. Modernisation and development of radio communication system necessary for surveillance and control of external borders
3. Development and upgrading of information systems and computer networks related to the implementation of the Schengen acquis
4. Construction of new and renovation and modernisation of the existing border infrastructure
5. Increase of the qualification of the border police
6. Development of the Croatian Visa Information System and connection to the EU Visa Information System (VIS)
7. Improvement of Schengen related knowledge and skills of the consular staff
8. Investment in the security equipment at diplomatic missions/consular posts according to the Schengen standards
9. Support costs for logistic and operations for managing the Schengen Facility for Croatia

The results of the public consultation will be taken into consideration for the preparation of the ex-post evaluation report on the implementation of the Schengen Facility for Croatia.

The evaluation is an important instrument to inform the European Parliament and the Council, the Member States, the research community, the general public and other stakeholders about the achievements of the measures/actions under the Schengen Facility for Croatia. It will also contribute to the design of the future similar EU-funded interventions.
